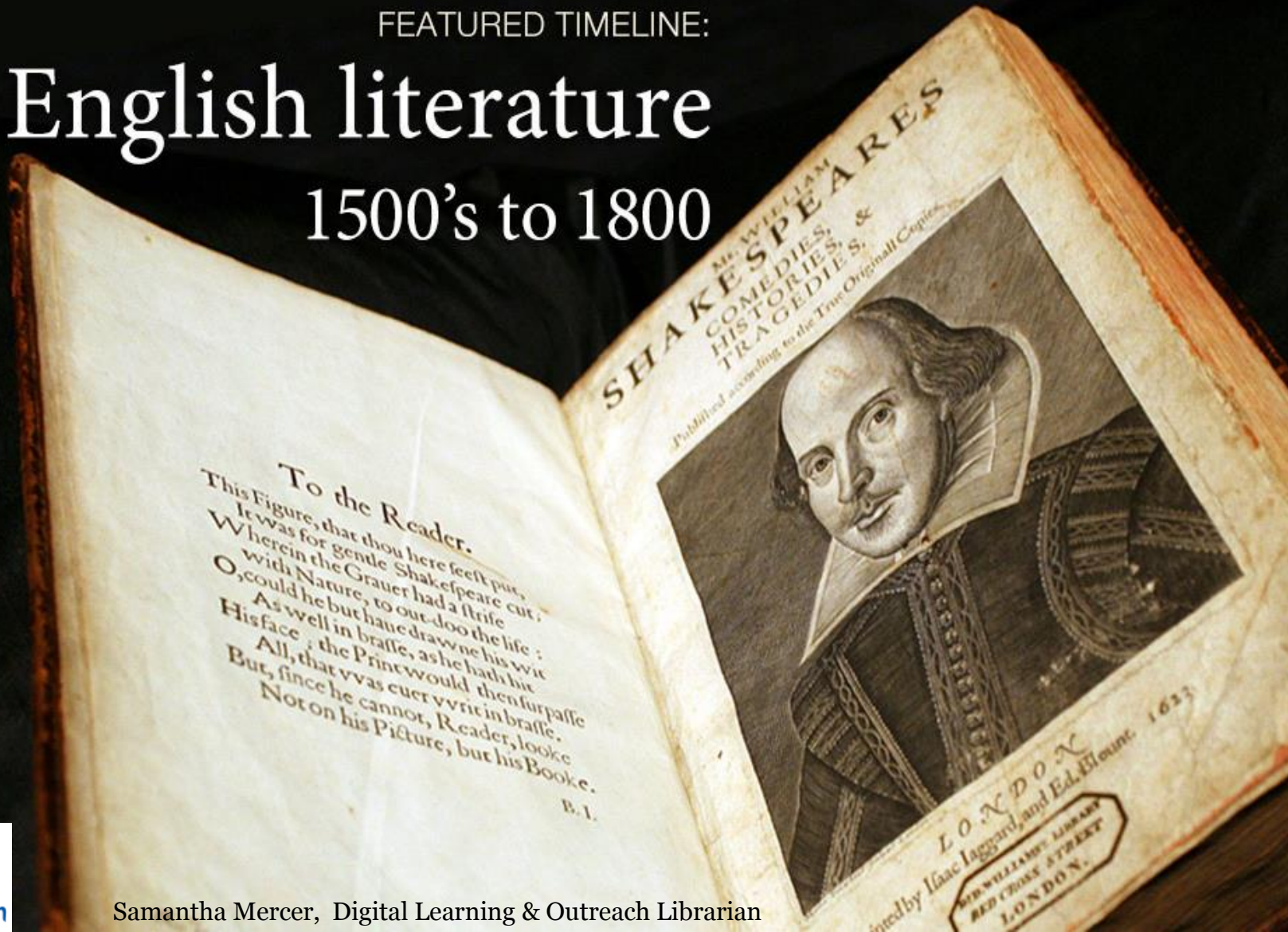


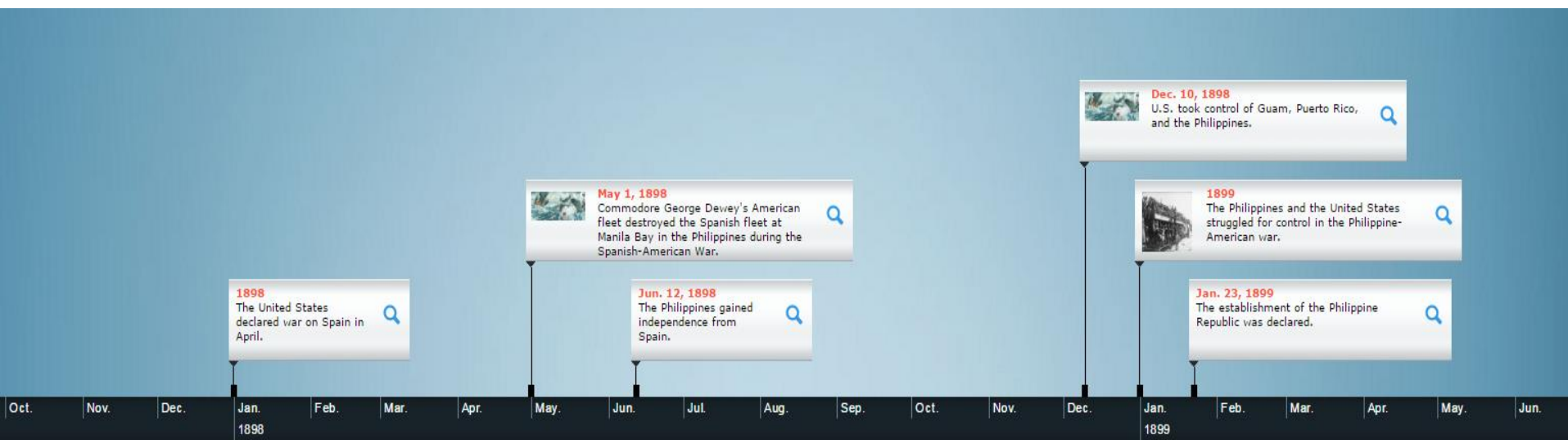

# World Book: Timeline

- World Book: Timeline helps you find and build your own timelines to help present information to others and to learn from them.
- The site allows you to use pre-made timelines as they are, edit pre-made timelines with pre-made events, edit pre-made timelines with new events or create your own timelines from scratch.
- You can add your own images to events or choose from World Book's collection, you can colour code events and add notes as descriptions.




# My Account

Use your account to compile all the websites, books, timelines, articles, images and sounds to one place. Your account is synced to all the World Book resources that require a password. Create a project title and save items you find on Info Finder with the timeline you created using World Book: Timeline and the primary documents you found on World Book: Reference Center.

Use the search bar on the top right to find timelines on a certain topic, keyword or time period

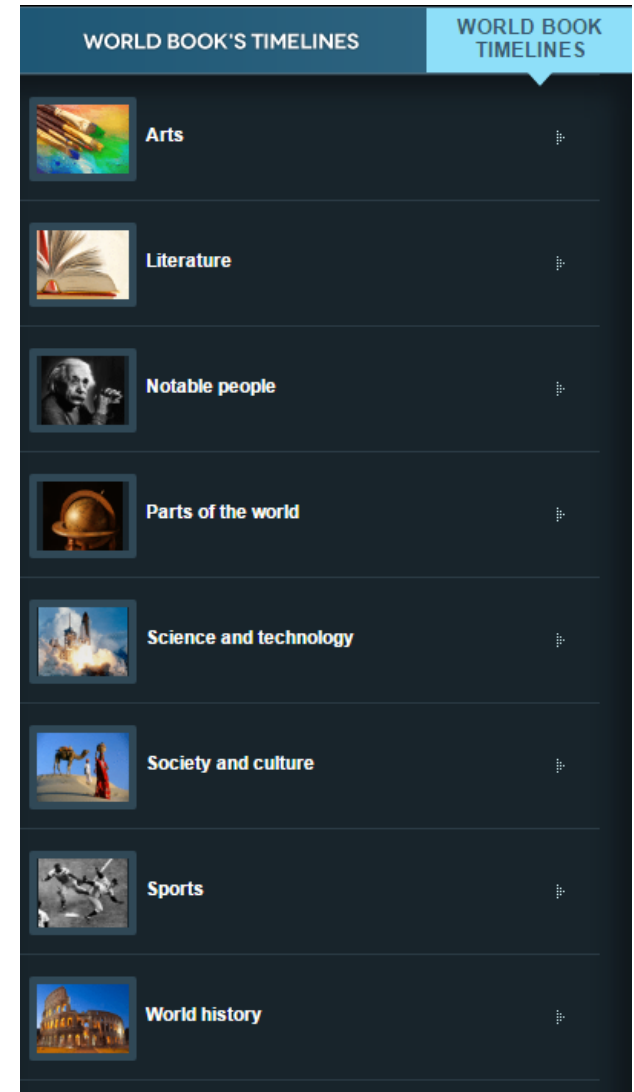

# Search Events


- Select Search Events from the top left of the timeline
- Search by keyword, start date or end date and your results will appear below
- Look through the events and select + beside the events you want to add to your timeline.
- Select the Done button when complete

# Create Events

- Select Create Event
- Type in the start date, end date (if applicable), event description and additional notes. You can also colour code your events.
- To add photos or multimedia select the Add image box on the left or click the Add Media tab. Search the World Book Catalogue or select upload
  - Personal uploads must be no larger than 5MB and be in JPG or GIF format.
- Browse your images, select terms & conditions and click upload
- Add a caption and click Add.

# Edit Events

- Select the image you want to edit or delete from your timeline.
- Select Edit
- To remove the event from your timeline, select Remove
- To edit the event, update the desired information and click Save.
- Once done editing and removing events, save your timeline.

# Create A Timeline

- Select Create a Timeline, pick a background theme, an image to represent your timeline, a title and a description.
- If you ever want to edit this information, select the pencil icon beside the title
- Select Create Event to create an event and its dates from scratch or select Search Event to see World Book's catalogue of events
- Make sure to save your timelines using the Save button on the top right. You can find them under My Timelines once you have done this.

# Edit World Book Timelines

- If you find a timeline that works mostly for you, you can use it and edit it instead of starting from scratch.
- Select the timeline that interests you and select Create Event to create an event from scratch or select Search Events
- Add the new events/information, colour code your events, update the title if needed and save your updated timeline. You can now find it under My Timelines.
